High Point premiere of this documentary by Matthew Barr, UNC filmmaker. Ellen Denker, Director of the North Carolina Furniture Heritage Project, will lead a gallery walk. Refreshments will be served.

Jackie Hedstrom from the High Point Library Heritage Center will reveal tales of murder, mayhem, and mystery in the area.

Mary Dalton, an award winning filmmaker and Wake Forest Associate Professor of Communications, will show her 26 minute film “Oakdale Cotton Mills: Close Knit Neighbors.”
